## John Swinney in Clydebank

I was delighted to have First Minister John Swinney in Clydebank for the launch of the RSV vaccine rollout. RSV is a common respiratory (lungs and airways) illness which can cause severe respiratory infections like pneumonia. The vaccine helps reduce the chances of getting an RSV infection. Scotland is leading the way being the first of the four nations to administer the vaccines.

## **SCOTTISH GOVERNMENT UPDATES**

Improving online connectivity - A Scottish Government programme to install 55 4G mobile phone masts in rural and island communities has improved home life, work life and business performance, according to new analysis.

Helping Uist parents back into work - A project providing training opportunities and childcare provision for parents, led by Comhairle nan Eilean Siar, has received £60,000 from the Scottish Government.

<u>Improving cancer care</u> - A total of £1.5 million funding in 2024-25 is supporting 12 projects to continue providing direct and personalised support to patients with cancer.

Afghan medical students arrive safely in Scotland - Nineteen female Afghan medical students have arrived in Scotland after they were banned from completing their studies by the authorities in Afghanistan.

Extending Carer Support Payment - Carer Support Payment, the replacement for Carer's Allowance, is now available in Aberdeen, Aberdeenshire, Fife, Moray and North, East and South Ayrshire.

Pay offer to NHS Agenda for Change staff - Nurses and healthcare staff across Scotland have been offered a pay increase of 5.5% that will ensure they have the best pay package in the UK.

Makar's tenure ends - First Minister John Swinney has thanked Scotland's national poet, Makar Kathleen Jamie, for her contribution to public life as her three year tenure comes to an end.
