SCOTTISH GOVERNMENT UPDATES

Recruiting and retaining childminders - Plans to grow Scotland's childminding workforce by 1,000 and provide more support to childminders have been announced.

Events to mark 80th anniversary of D-Day - First Minister John Swinney will represent the people of Scotland at national commemorations honouring the 80th Anniversary of the D-Day landings.

Off-Peak All Day Rail Trial Extended - The Scottish Government has extended the off-peak rail trial until September.

Apology to victims of infected blood scandal - First Minister John Swinney has formally apologised on behalf of the government to everyone who has been infected or affected as a result of infected NHS blood or blood products in Scotland.

Cancelling School Meal Debt - The Scottish Government has opened a new £1.5 million fund to help councils cancel school meal debt.

New training facility for NHS Scotland workforce - Health Secretary Neil Gray has opened the NHS Scotland Academy Skills and Simulation Centre at Clydebank's Golden Jubilee University National Hospital.

National mathematics specialist appointed - A former mathematics teacher has been appointed to lead a new approach to driving improvements to Scotland's maths curriculum.
